How to pack your slitter knifes for shipping

When sending your knife out to be re-sharpened, you need to make sure that you don't cause more damage by improper packing. If the knives bounce against each other during shipping, they can chip each other and will incur extra damage requiring extra work to sharpen or possibly become unserviceable. It is best to pack the box as tight as possible using cardboard to prevent anything from moving around and spacers between each knife to prevent them from touching anything.

Any extra work required will be quoted above the standard grind pricing.

It is a good idea to clean your knives before packing them as well, and you can remove the gib keys and set screws because they will be replaced
